The program should take less than two hours to complete. It is divided in to six sections with a pop quiz at the end of each section and a final exam. The sections closely follow the Legions Four Pillars of service. They include History & Organization, Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children and Youth. If desired, you can take a final online exam. If you pass this exam you'll receive a digital certificate of recognition; a lapel/cap pin will also be delivered to those who successfully complete the course. The online course is \$4.95 for members of The American Legion and Sons of The American Legion. If you want to know the American Legion, this program is well worth the time and the cost.
