Meeting was called to order at 1907 hrs by the Commander.

Roll of Post officers was called with all officers present.

The Executive Meeting minutes were read with motions to accept by Eugene Weil and seconded by Robert Thomas. Minutes were approved by membership.

The Membership Report was given as 86 paid members. The Commander spoke on the reasons why it was important to have dues paid on time -1.) It can jeopardize your continuous membership status and 2.) If you are not paid up for 2019 and you request assistance from the National Emergency Fund, you will be denied. Paid members are eligible for \$1,000 insurance through the Legion. Poppies – The Poppy chair gave a report on the August 24th sale at WalMart. Donations totaling \$1,326.60 were received. Recommendations were made for the use of the funds of \$200 to the Honor Flight of Southern Illinois, \$300 to the Haven, \$200 to the Fisher House, \$300 to Gifts to the Yanks and \$100 to the USO. An additional \$153 would be used to purchase 1,000 poppies leaving \$73.60 for future needs. A motion was made to accept the recommendations by Eugene Weil and seconded by Bob Burack. Membership unanimously approved.

Veteran Affairs – Doug Jameson reported there was little to report other than they had a speaker from the Perryville Joseph Center.
