Items desired include but are not limited to hard candies, Snacks, Peanuts, Pistachio nuts, Cookies, Chips, Beef jerky, Chap Stick, Spices, Hot sauce, Ranch salad dressing, batteries (mostly AA), Zip lock bags, travel size tooth paste and other travel sized toiletries hard pack Pringles, nuts, white crew socks, disposable razors, Crystal drink packs, and women's travel toiletries.

On December 31, 2010 an EF3 Tornado with winds up to 165 MPH struck Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo. Damage reported so far resulted in 56 families who lost everything, another 159 homes were affected and of those 41 were completely destroyed and 32 had moderate damage. Currently, operations are in the process of relocating 300 military and family members. Families that have been displaced and residing in temporary housing are in need of new or slightly used winter clothing (all ages and sexes) as well as bedding, hygiene items diapers, dry goods, paper products, canned goods, spices, small kitchen appliances, pots & pans, dishes, etc. Basically, anything required to run a household. We have already sent over 30 boxes to the distribution point. We're still looking for more items.
