December 28, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 1900 hours by the Commander.

Roll of Post officers was called Commander Page, Adjutant Devine, Finance Officer Burrack, Sgt at Arms Green, (Executive Committee) Robert Thomas, all present. Excused were JrV Martin, Executive Board Member Kori Bookman, and Sgt at Arms Stacy. Absent were Executive Committee Member Andrew Dunham.

The Sgt. At Arms introduced April Tarbill from Post 58 in attendance.

November 2022 meeting minutes were read with motion to accept by Steve Duff and seconded by Mary Monett. Minutes approved by membership.

The Membership Report was given showing the post currently has 120 paid members out of 150, 80%, for the current year. Gold cards were received for Jennifer and Robert McCarty. We may have 5 more due to a check that was received by the Finance Officer.

The Finance Officer provided a breakdown of the post's accounts with \$3,219.16 in Savings and \$6,831.84 in Checking for a total of \$10,051.00 with \$2,249.00 reserved for insurance, vet visitation program and Honor Guard. Motioned to accept, subject to audit by Steve Duff, seconded by John Boothe. Membership approved.

Poppies – Steve Duff contacted Schnucks at Swansea. They told him to contact corporate. He found a form for solicitation which required our Tax ID and other documents which were submitted for May 20th. We are still waiting on a reply. Schnucks allows three solicitations per year.

Veteran Affairs – The next meeting of the St. Clair VAC will be January 31st at 7 p.m.

Community Patriotic Observances – Mike King, Post 1937, is working to revitalize the Belleville Memorial Day Parade. He will provide updates when they become available. Robin mentioned there may be an unused float available to use for members that cannot walk the distance. Steve Duff asked about the availability of flag bearer straps stating they were needed for the 7 December ceremony. This will be looked into.

Honor Guard – Doug Jameson will be leading the team while Rich is out of town for several weeks. Rich voiced his concern over the amount of time it is taking to get the rifles. The Commander stated there is a very heavy carbon build-up and the volunteer was trying to find a way to safely clean them. Once the weapons are ready, Rich wants training to include working with another post during a funeral so members can be familiarized with the process. Rich also stated he still had an extra ascot available.

Boy Scouts – We've also received the latest information for awards and scholarships. We will be sending it to our scout units soon.
