

# Charles A. Woodford American Legion Post 2007



### January 27, 2025

Meeting was called to order at 1907 hours by the Commander.

Roll of Post officers was called with all officers and Executive Committee members were present with the excused absence of Sgt at Arms Gary Stacy and the absence of Executive Committee Member Robert Thomas.

Sgt at Arms, Kenny Green introduced guests Al Mahan, 22nd District Commander and CJ Ocasio Post 292.

The Commander suspended the reading of the minutes so copies of the minutes for November and December could be passed out to membership for review.

The **Membership Report** was given showing the Post with 136 of 158 paid members for 86.08%. There was a brief discussion on the difference National's numbers and the Department's. The Commander explained why these differences occur at the various levels.

**Finance Report** – The Finance Officer reported we had a checking account balance of \$6,927.78 available with and an additional \$723.27 in savings. We also have \$3,000 in a short-term Certificate of Deposit. A breakdown of funds held for the various programs was also provided. He then asked members to consider serving in a position at various levels, replacing others in an elected position. He also impressed the importance of reviewing the Bylaws. Commander Mahan announced he had t-shirts available for the upcoming Suicide Awareness Walk that will be held on May 10<sup>th</sup>. Shirts are \$20 each.
