26 October 2020 Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 1905 hrs by the Commander.

Roll of Post officers was called with all officers present except the excused absence of Executive Committee member Jerry Sauerwein.

The Sgt at Arms stated there were no visitors in attendance.

September meeting minutes were read with motion to accept by Doug Jameson and seconded by Andrew Dunham. Minutes approved by membership.

The Executive Meeting minutes were read with motions to accept by Doug Jameson and were seconded by Bob Burrack. Minutes approved by membership.

The Membership Report was given showing 116 paid members for the current year. The Commander spoke on membership, discussing a possible membership drive with several volunteers to make calls. He also stated there were three ways to pay dues; at the meeting, mailing it in or paying online through National. The Commander then called off names of members still needing to pay dues and asked if anyone present recognized the names, to please make contact with them to remind them.

The Finance Officer gave his Report. Motions to accept subject to audit by Douglas Reid and seconded Bill Martin. Membership approved.

Poppies –The planned Poppy Day on November 7th was cancelled by Walmart. A discussion followed that we could possibly partner with the Fish Stand in back of the Swansea Improvement Center to try and sell poppies during their sales.

Honor Guard – Rich Gabel spoke on his Honor Guard uniforming experience. He also suggested the possible use of the uniforms when selling poppies. Our gift order is already in and we're looking at early December to go to the homes.

Flag Boxes – Kenny Green will be getting with a sheet metal company to see if they can do it. The Commander was able to purchase a container that can be used as a drop box. It will need to be repainted. We need permission from the Improvement Center to anchor the box to the building there.

The Commander paid the District per Capita bill while he was at the Revitalization event held 8-10 October and will seek reimbursement for \$15.20 he paid out of pocket.

New Business -

- The Commander was able to obtain a non-working trumpet from a local musician.
- Doug suggested that the Post provide lunches for the Davey Tree crew on 6 November and possibly get some publicity. The Commander mentioned that Davey Tree requested minimal people there due to the possibility of danger during tree cutting.
- Rich Gabel motioned to use the 50/50 funds up to \$35 to pay for the lunches. Les O'Neal seconded. Membership approved.
