September 22, 2024

Meeting was called to order at 1906 hours by the Commander.

Roll of Post officers was called with all officers and Executive Committee members were present with the absence of Executive Committee Member Robert Thomas and the excused absence or Kori Bookman.

Sgt at Arms, Kenny Green introduced guests Don Scheyer, 22nd District Sr Vice Commander and Al Mahan, 22nd District Commander.

The Adjutant stated minutes were sent out to all members with an email on record. No corrections were noted. The Commander stated that as there were no objections, the minutes were accepted as posted.

The **Membership Report** was given showing the Post with 87 of 158 paid members for 55.06%.

Unfinished Business

- 1. POW/MIA Ceremony The host did not contact the Commander until the Thursday before the event. The date was changed from Friday to Saturday. Our Post had two members attend and only two members from the host Post attended.
- 2. Eagle Scout Project Gabe is working on approval from the Council for his project.
- 3. Flags for Messinger Cemetery Steve Duff provided a detailed breakdown of the material needed with the cost. Rich Gaebel motioned to accept the proposal with costs not to exceed \$500. Robin Latdrick seconded. Membership approved. We will need to create a list of days the flags would be displayed at Messinger Cemetery. They will be stored at the Swansea Rotatory when not in use. Steve and Gary will help with sourcing the material at Menards.
- 4. Attendance A proposal was made for a 33/33/33 lottery drawing to replace the current 50/50 drawing. Mary Monett The system allows funds to build up over time. The names of all members would be placed in a container and at each meeting a name would be pulled. The member must be present to win. The winner would receive a third of the pot. Rich Gaebel motioned to accept the new system. This was seconded by Barb Page. Membership approved. Mary Monett then motioned that \$50 be allocated as seed money. Seconded by Todd Herzog. Membership approved.
- 5. Eagle Plaque Steve Duff provided a photo of the Eagle Plaque given to Wolf Branch School in its new position within the school.
- 6. Scott AFB Honor Guard The Commander stated he spoke with the base Honor Guard and found they only provide service for active duty and retirees of the Air Force, Army Air Forces and Army Air Corps. The Commander said that an Army unit from northern Illinois has in the past provided services for Army service members. JB Barracks does have several teams; however, they are normally tied up with the many burial ceremonies held there. The Navy does have a team in St Louis that can provide

services for Naval service members. Steve Duff says he will check with Lakeview Cemetery staff to see if there were any other options available.

- 3. Steve Duff them spoke on the upcoming Wolf Branch School Veterans Program scheduled for Friday, 8 November. We need to coordinate the Firing Team with the school's Resource Officer. The Commander asked for volunteers for the Honor Guard. We will need to get the wreath from storage and ensure it is presentable.
- 4. Steve Duff also noted that the Donor wall at Wolf Branch had lettering that was coming off. The school is addressing the issue.

- 1. Don Scheyer presented the post with a 90% membership certificate. The award was given to Bill Martin for his continuing efforts in the membership program.
- 2. Al Mahan, 22nd District Commander, then spoke on membership. He stated that everyone needs to recruit 2 members: one to grow and one to replace. He then spoke briefly on the National Convention. He also wanted to establish a VAC in every county. They have a few new locations already in the works. He also emphasized the importance of attending District and Division meetings. They need more units to attend. It was noted that the 5th Division Caucus was being help on 20 October in Marion and the 22nd District Caucus was being held on 6 October in O'Fallon.

50/50 results for half of the \$56 collected went to Steve Duff who donated the \$28 back to the Gifts to the Yanks program.
