MEETING NOTICE: Our next scheduled meeting will be held on September 28, 2015. It will begin at 7:00 P.M. Other dates are listed on the right.

MEMBERSHIP: Our final 2015 membership was 167. As of 24 August our 2016 membership was 101 which, by the way, is a decent start. We need only 66 to gain the coveted 100%. That's the good news.

The bad news (which you should have read about in the national magazine) is that the National Organization has , at the 2015 National Convention, raised their dues \$5.00 effective I January 2016.

What's that mean to you? Nothing this year if you've already paid your dues, or, if you pay your dues before January 1, 2016. After January 1, 2016 you will have to pay more, since the Post's current dues of \$30.00 is not enough to cover this change. How much more will be determined at the September meeting. Want input? Show up.

Your \$30.00 dues is split -as follows: National \$13.50, Department \$12.50, Post \$4.00. After January I, National will get \$18.50.

If you are a PUFL ($\underline{\mathbf{P}}$ aid $\underline{\mathbf{U}}$ p $\underline{\mathbf{F}}$ or $\underline{\mathbf{L}}$ ife) you don't have to worry about this or any other dues increase.

I would strongly encourage you to pay your dues by 20 December which would give us time to process them and get them in to department.

As it stands right now, 2017 and later years dues will be the same as what will be paid after I January 2016 until Department and/or National change their percapita again.

Normally, I would suggest If you can see your way clear to buy a PUFL, that it would simplify your life and ours. However, that is your decision. In the past a PUFL was a pretty good deal for everyone. When you purchased one, the cost was based on the amount of dues collected by the post you belonged to. Low cost post like ours was less expensive than those from a higher cost post. That is not the case now. Now it is based on age

Still, for those who can afford the initial cost a PUFL can save you some money over the long haul.

For instance:

If you are between 18 and 29 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$1,399. L\Your life expectancy is between 49 and 59 years so the annualized cost would be between \$24 and \$29 dollars.

None of the money collected is used for Post operations.

If you are between 30 and 39 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$1,275. Your life expectancy is between 40 and 48 years so the annualized cost would be between \$27 and \$32 dollars.

If you are between 40 and 49 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$1,120. Your life expectancy is between 30 and 38 years so the annualized cost would be between \$29 and \$37 dollars.

If you are between 50 and 59 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$935. Your life expectancy is 22 to 30 years so the annualized cost would be between \$36 and \$42 dollars.

If you are between 60 and 69 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$740. Your life expectancy is 14 to 21 years so the annualized cost would be between \$35 and \$49 dollars.

If you are between 70 and 79 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$550. Your life expectancy is 5 to 9 years so the annualized cost would be between \$39 and \$60 dollars.

If you are between 80 and 89 years of age, a PUFL would cost \$399. Your life expectancy is 4 to 8 years so the annualized cost would be between \$50 and \$100 dollars.

If you are 90 or older a PUFL would cost \$399.you.

If you should decide that a PUFL would be a good deal for you, you can pay in either of 3 ways.

- I. Check/ Money Order.
- 2. 12 monthly payments. Billed to your credit card.
- 3. Full amount billed to your credit card.
